A Creative Common (CC) license allows distribution of a copyrighted image or work.



Works licenced under a Creative Common license are based on copyright law.



Whenever using an image or work you should give the author/creator credit.



There are several types of **CC** licenses that indicate terms of distribution.



Attribution (BY)
Share-alike (SA)

- Share-alike (SA) (1) - Non-commercial (NC) (1)
- Non-derivative (ND)



You can <u>create your own</u> <u>CC license</u> to label images, work, documents, art, presentations or website.



Be sure to attribute (give credit) to works when using them in presentations.



Be sure to use only CC or public domain images and resources to avoid copyright violations.
